



LIMA 2014. COP 20

The CILSS is inviting developing countries to give a priority to the integration of climate change in planning and budgeting.

That invitation was the action of Dr Djimé Adoum, Executive Secretary of the CILSS, during the Side Event of December 4th 2014 co-organised by Niger, the CILSS and the NGO Clean Energy Nepal on the Theme National Planning of the Adaptation.

During this event which gathered about 200 persons, the Executive Secretary has as well, in his welcoming address, highlighted the contribution of two initiatives of the CILSS namely the Global Climate Change Alliance (GCCA) and the Project Adaptation of Climate Change in the agricultural and water sector that permitted to the CILSS to get involved in the promotion of the CC integration in planning and budgeting through national capacity-building workshops of countries.

In addition, he emphasised the relevance of the capacity-building programme on Climate Change Integration in policies and budgeting processes scheduled by the CILSS with the technical support of the intra ACP secretariat, which permitted to transfer to states a number of tools namely the figuring of the adaptation according to Dr Adoum, these information represent key additional values for the elaboration of Nation Climate Change Adaptation plans and National Intentional Determined contribution (INDC) that different countries will start in the coming months .

After the intervention of the Executive secretary of the CILSS, Mister Batu Uprety president of PMA expert group did an introduction on the Side Event theme.

Then it was up to the panellists to present the following points

- Integration to Climate Change Adaptation in the planning through capacity-building and the preparation to Climate funding in West Africa ,by Dr Benoit SARR,CILSS.
- Integration of climate Change in the framework planning in Niger .by Doctor Kamayé Maâzou, focal person of CCNUCC and Executive Secretary of the National council of Environment for sustainable Development (CNEDD), Niger.
- Lessons learnt from the Global support plan to National Adaptation plans (PAG-PNA), by Mrs Ermira Fida, PAG-PNA In his communication, Dr Benoît presented:
- Thematic highlighted by the different CILSS Initiatives in terms of Climate Change.

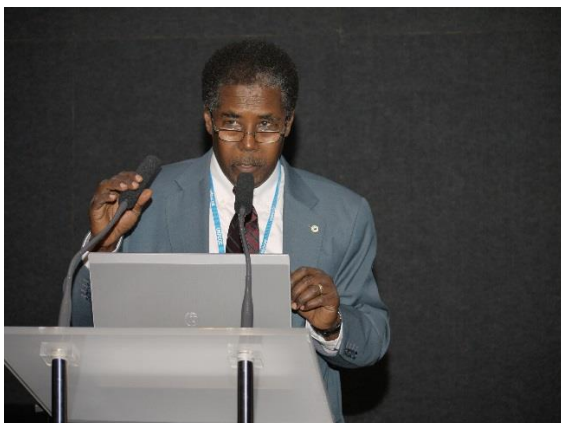
- Climate variability and its impacts with an emphasised on: Global warming in West Africa, evolving of rainfall in the Sahel from 1950-2005 and looses on cereal productions for 2050.
- Efforts of CILSS countries in terms of Climate change integration in national budget in agriculture sector.
- An overview on some technologies of smart Agriculture meeting the climate in West Africa
- The CILSS programme in terms of Climate change integration in policies through capacity-building
- The overview of Climate funding in West Africa
- Perspectives in terms of accompanying of countries to make effective the integration of CC in sectorial policy documents.

The presentation of Dr Kamayé Maâzou was essentially focused on planning efforts at local level and in different sectorial policies .He has as well met challenges related to this exercise in Niger .The presentation of Mrs Emira Fidaa for her concern, was related to experience sharing and support to countries for the elaboration of national Adaptation Plan.

The different presentations were followed by fruitful debates that show the relevance and the necessity to promote Climate Change Integration in the planning and budgeting
